Suffix ful

LO: to convert nouns and verbs into adjectives

When we add a suffix to a root word we generate a new word with a different meaning.

To form an adjective we can add the suffix - ful - to nouns and verbs.

LO: to convert nouns and verbs into adjectives

For root words which end in a consonant we can simply just add the suffix.

Example

fear becomes fear + ful = fearful

faith faith + ful =

boast boast + ful =

doubt doubt + ful =

thank thank + ful =

LO: to convert nouns and verbs into adjectives

For root words which end in a consonant followed by y we must change the y to an i before we add the suffix.

Example

mercy

mercy + ful = merc i ful = merciful

plenty

plenty + ful =

beauty

beauty + ful =

pity


pity + ful =
